Community Events

We organized or sponsored the following, some in collaboration with other Indivisible Chapters and activist groups: Hands Off!; No Kings Day 1 and 2; Good Trouble Lives On; Labor Day 17x17; and many Redwood City, Tesla Takedowns, and Science for Sanity rallies. 18 members trained to de-escalate conflicts as Peace Ambassadors.

Action Teams

Members taking action through the following teams: Immigrant Rights, Transgender and Queer Rights, Voting Rights, Safety Net Programs, Reproductive and Women's Rights, Health and Science, and Education.

Connections to State and Federal Electeds

Met with Congressmen Liccardo and Mullin, and State Senator Becker, and their staff, to ensure they hear from their constituents and are informed to speak on our behalf. Liccardo and Mullin spoke at member meetings. Members made numerous phone calls and wrote letters to hold legislators accountable for progressive policies, and thank them for stepping up and standing out when they do so.

One Million Rising (OMR)

This fantastic framework engages community members in small group settings to resist authoritarianism. Over 500 community members engaged to take action.

Building Community

Monthly meetings with refreshments, action items and speakers. Regular socials: coffees, happy hours, sign-making parties! A regular book club, and a speaker series.

Leading the Way

Collaboration with Indivisible leaders, including hosting a leadership summit. Collaboration with other activist groups and nonprofits including Bake Back Better, Swing Left Peninsula, Faith in Action. Educated and organized our community to support the successful passage of Proposition 50.

Defending Immigrant Communities

Participated in the national Signs of Solidarity campaign. Meeting with local police chiefs - both in support of immigrants and to keep ICE in check.

Supporting Local Businesses

"Shop local" campaign and business directory, and boycott of Target, Amazon, Home Depot, and more. Our chapter held our events at local businesses whenever possible.

Digital and Traditional Media Presence

Weekly Action newsletter, website, Brave in the Bay Podcast, robust social media presence, and active Slack channels. Numerous newspaper articles, as well as TV interviews.

Community Donations

Gathered over \$19,000 in donations for community nonprofits such as Faith in Action and the ACLU. Collected 600+ canned goods for Second Harvest Food Bank, and 100+ books for a local children's book drive.
